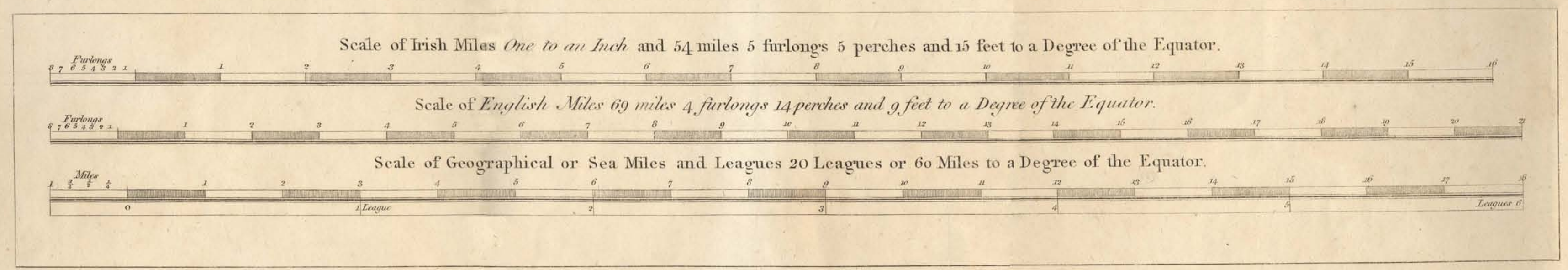
The figures denote the least depth of Water below which r signifies Rocky ground in mud or ooze, g Gravel & Sand, s Shell or Shell sand
